- a. April 22, 2013. Cape May County Conference of Mayors. Shore Inquirer Article dated April 16, 2013. "N.J. adds drop off sites for unneeded medications. Concerned about a dramatic increase in the abuse of prescriptions, the New Jersey Division of Consumer Affairs announced the expansion Tuesday of "Project Medicine Drop." It now includes 40 locations statewide, a significant increase since the project reached all 21 counties last fall, officials said. Thirteen sites were added. In South Jersey, the locations are:
