Marc DeBlasio, Municipal Engineer spoke about grant money for playgrounds. Total of grant is \$40,405, broken down \$29,043 for Goshen Davies Sports Complex and \$11, 362 for Rio Grande playground. Also has been going over electric bills for the Township and is trying to find some ways to save money. Has spoken with AC Electric and they are to get back to him next week. Has also been in contract with Louis Berger Group for updated plans for GSP. The Township Committee has to review the plans and come to a consensus on the noise barrier. When plans received, will sit down with Committee to review.

Committeewoman DeLanzo said she looks forward to working on the budget plan for the next couple of years and we will have some future challenges to overcome. She attended the BayWay Meeting with Elizabeth Terenik. This extends from Salem County to the tip of Cape May County and will go down Rt 47 and highlight our bayside communities. This is all in the beginning stages right now. Went to the Emeritus for their ribbon cutting of their new computer room. They are offering residents the availability to SKYPE with their family and friends.

Committeeman Donohue acknowledged the Middle Township Wrestling Program and the 8th grade girls basketball winning the title. Young people doing great things. Also stated the budget shows the residents that we are serious about property taxes. We have a lot of work ahead and need to think outside the box. We are all committed to this.

27. PUBLIC COMMENT:

Jim McGill stated he was under the impression that the sound barriers for the GSP was a done deal.

Barbara Cresse wanted to know where the recreation area was in Rio Grande.

Committeeman Donohue stated Railroad Avenue.

Barbara Cresse inquired as to the debt service for firehouse and who owns it. She was told the Township owns it.

Mark Mallett said the old firehouse was purchased for \$1.2 million.

Mayor Lockwood said the new firehouse is owned by the Fire Commissioners.

Carol Mattessich questions what materials we purchase from the gravel pit that the bid was awarded to.

Mark Mallett told her recycled concrete and asphalt.

Carol Mattessich wanted to know where we got the \$228,000 for the Whitesboro Sanitary Sewer.

Mayor Lockwood advised it came from a grant from the USDA. Said contract started before Pay to Play and Township sought legal counsel to straighten it out.

Committeeman Donohue stated it was a mess, work was done but went over contract amount. Contractor was advised by Committee that we would only pay what was left in the USDA Grant.

Carol Mattessich is concerned about sound barriers on the GSP. Said we could become a fly by community.

Madelyn McCarroll spoke about the taxes and people who could not afford increases. Thanked Committee for no increase. Agrees with Susan that we need to get started for future year's taxes. Suggested instead of having sound barriers on the GSP, why couldn't plantings be done for a natural barrier. Questioned the irrigation well at Ft. Apache.

Mark Mallett advised the well project was started a couple of years ago and we are just now finishing up.

Mayor Lockwood advised that the Committee will be meeting with employees tomorrow night to get some input from them on things that could make the Township function better and be more geared towards helping the residents.

Jan would like for the Committee to take another look at our Security Alarm System ordinance.

Chief Leusner explained that in prior years there were over 150 false alarms a month, which was a lot for the police department to handle along with other duties. They are now down to 80 false alarms. Out of 1,000 alarm sites, over 600 were not registered. The alarm ordinance has been a real value to the police in having more time on the street instead of going to false alarms.

Carl Carmelowicz questioned if fire department is volunteer, is it funded by Middle Township and do the fire commissioners have meetings? Also wanted to know if the sound barriers would be at the expense of the GSP.

Mayor Lockwood told him yes to all of the above. The barriers on the GSP may have a mild impact to the township, which would mostly be disruption. We are in no hurry to approve the sound barriers.

Committee went into Closed Session at 8:05pm.
