What is the Boat Shrink Wrap Recycling Program?

This recycling program provides an opportunity for boat owners, marinas, boat storage yards, municipalities, and individuals to recycle clear, white and blue colored boat shrink wrap. Greenhouse film plastic, used by farmers, nurseries and gardeners can also be recycled through this program.

How is Boat Shrink Wrap Recycled?

Boat shrink wrap and film plastic brought to CMCMUA facilities for recycling is shipped to a recycler for processing. The material usually returns to the market place as plastic lumber that can be used to build decks, docks and outdoor furniture.

The CMCMUA's Shrink Wrap Recycling Program was developed in cooperation with NJDEP's Coastal Management Program, the New Jersey Marine Sciences Consortium, and the NJDOT's Office of Maritime Resources, I BOAT NJ Program.

The CMCMUA program for recycling boat shrink wrap is easy, convenient and **FREE**.

CMCMUA BOAT SHRINK WRAP AND GREEN-HOUSE FILM RECYCLING PROGRAM

WHO: boat owners, marinas, municipalities, individuals, boat storage yards, farmers and gardeners

WHAT: Boat shrink wrap (may be blue, white or clear) and green-house film. Accepted free of charge.

WHERE: CMCMUA Transfer Station in Burleigh, Middle Township, and the CMCMUA Landfill Complex in Woodbine.

WHEN: During normal operating hours. (See hours on back panel.)

HOW: Residents and businesses can bring boat shrink wrap and green-house film to the Transfer Station or Landfill Complex.

Boat shrink wrap and greenhouse film are accepted FREE.

Recycling Tips

Loads of boat shrink wrap and/or greenhouse film <u>must</u> be clean; free of dirt and other debris.

Shrink wrap used to protect equipment other than boats is acceptable under this program.

Residents or businesses that generate quantities of other unprinted film plastic waste should call the CMCMUA to find out if the film plastic is a compatible material and can be recycled along with boat shrink wrap.

More Recyclables

Recreational boaters, marinas and boat yards may generate these recyclables:

- Scrap metal
- **Bulky rigid plastics (up to 5 gallons in size)
- Plastic pallets
- **Corrugated boxes and paper
- **Aluminum and steel cans, glass and plastic bottles
- Wood pallets
- ** These materials accepted as Single

Stream Recyclable Materials

Contact your municipal recycling coordinator or the CMCMUA for information about Single Stream Recycling and recycling these and other materials.

Is Boat Shrink Wrap Collected Curbside with other recyclables?

No. This recycling program is voluntary and it is a drop-off program. Call your municipality to find out if a special collection service is available in your area.
