6. ORDINANCE 1529-16 – AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MIDDLE, CHAPTER 70, SECTION 3, MIDDLE TOWNSHIP TRAFFIC COMMITTEE (MEMBERSHIP) – Following second reading, hearing, and consideration for adoption, Ordinance 1529-16 was adopted on motion by Committeemember Donohue seconded by Committeemember DeVico and passed on roll call. Complete Ordinance is on file in the Clerk's Office.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Middle in the County of Cape May and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 70, Section 3 of the Code of the Township of Middle is hereby amended as follows:

The Middle Township Traffic Committee shall consist of the following:

A. Seven voting members who shall be chosen from the general public. Each member shall have a term of three years' duration. All existing members of the Traffic Committee shall maintain the terms for which they were heretofore appointed.

B. Nonvoting members.

(1) Six nonvoting advisory members comprised of the following:

- (a) Mayor.
- (b) Township Engineer.
- (c) County Engineer.

- (d) One Chief of any Middle Township fire or rescue squad.
- (e) One representative of the Middle Township Police Department.
- (f) One representative of the Department of Transportation.

(2) Each advisory member shall have a term of one year.  
C. Three (3) Alternate Members having a term of two years' duration.

SECTION 2. All other ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed, to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency.

SECTION 3. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phase of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remaining portions of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect, and to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final passage and publication, according to law.
