

THE "HOW TO DISPOSE OF" LIST

Rugs, Furniture, Large Household Items That are NOT Metal - The trash contractor will pick up ONE room size rug (rolled up and cut no longer than 4-6 feet including padding) each week as a bulk item. Other bulk items are permitted to be put curb side, one per week.

Refrigerators, Freezers, Air Conditioners

Picked up curbside. Please remove doors and lay face down at curb.

Call Public Works at 465-8745 for pick up.

Tree Branches & Brush

Must be freshly cut, no longer than 6-8 ft in length and free of roots and soil.

Place at curbside in an orderly fashion with all cut ends facing roadway clear of trees, electrical wires, and mailboxes.

This service is provided to established residences and is not applied to clearing of underdeveloped property.

Tree Roots, Stumps, & Logs

Are not picked up by the Township.

Used Motor Oil

Can be put out at curbside for pick-up or brought to the Public Works building or taken to the Transfer Station. Used motor oil must be put into a clear container (not bigger than a gallon plastic jug) with a tight fitting lid and labeled

USED MOTOR OIL CANNOT BE MIXED WITH ANTIFREEZE.

No Wood

~~Wood is not accepted for curbside pickup. Wood must be placed in a separate container and taken to the Transfer Station. Wood is not accepted for curbside pickup.~~

Recycling Procedures



Recycling Day is the Same Day as Trash Pick up Day



Things to put in your Blue Recycling Can

Glass

RECYCLE - Bottles and Jars

DO NOT RECYCLE - Dishes, drinking glasses, window glass, pottery or ceramics and light bulbs.

Aluminum Cans & Bi-Metal Cans

RECYCLE - Soda and beer cans, cat and dog food cans, vegetable and other food cans.

DO NOT RECYCLE - Cans that contained paint thinner or chemical solvents, paint cans, aluminum foil, aluminum trays or pie pans.

Plastics

RECYCLE - Milk and water containers, detergent bottles, bleach bottles and other plastic bottles with the number 1 or 2 on the bottom.

DO NOT RECYCLE - Any plastic bottles that contained antifreeze, motor oil, or petroleum auto products.

Please Rinse Containers & Remove Caps & Lids.
Do Not Flatten Containers



Things to put in Your White Recycling Can

Paper

RECYCLE - Newspaper, magazines, office paper, pamphlets, corrugated cardboard boxes. All materials must be clean. Shredded paper should be placed in a see through plastic bag or a paper bag and then placed in your paper recycling can.

DO NOT RECYCLE - Pizza boxes, carbon paper, paper plates, milk or juice cartons, napkins, paper towels, tissues or newspapers that are soiled.

Large Cardboard boxes should be flattened. (Free of packing popcorn, plastic and wood) weighted down at curb side

• Receptacles other than those provided by the Township must be labeled for the type of recycled material they contain, and no bigger than a 32 gallon container - no lid.

General Information for Household Trash & Recycling Collection

Regular household trash should preferably be placed in receptacles with tight fitting lids no bigger than 32 gal. container.

All items, trash and recycling will be collected on your regularly scheduled days.

Trash and Recycling should be neatly displayed at curbside by 7 am on the day of pick up, but no earlier than 6 pm the previous day. After pickup, remove the empty cans to the rear or side of property. All containers used for recycling must be clearly marked and must be set out at curbside without lids.

Construction Materials - Sheet rock, lumber, shingles, floor tiles, etc. are not picked up by the Township or the trash contractor. This material is the responsibility of the contractor or property owner. Asphalt, concrete, cinder block & bricks are not picked up either.

Automobiles - The Township will arrange for the free pickup and removal of any junk vehicle a resident wants removed. Call 465-8745

Auto Batteries - Picked upcurb side by the recycling truck.

Auto Tires - Picked up curb side by the recycling truck or can be taken to county MUA. Call for details 465-5004

Grass Clippings - are best disposed of by the "cut it and leave it" method. Bagged grass clipping and leaves will be picked up curb side. They can be bagged in clear plastic bags or marked with Township (orange) stickers.

Orange stickers are free and available at our Public Works building, 400 Mechanic St. CMCH or at Townhall, 33 Mechanic St.

CMCH bags must not exceed 50 lbs. OR GREY TARPED BAGS
Hypodermic Needles - Must be rendered inoperable according to State law (tip broken off). Free containers are offered through the "Safe Disposal Program" at Cape Regional Medical Center. Call 463-2491.

Christmas Trees - Put to curbside for pickup. Please make sure the tree has all decorations and stand removed. No plastic bags please!

Leaves - Bagged in clear plastic bags or flattened newspaper. Raked leaves in bulk will be uncummed curb side through curbside. Must be free of branches and trash and at least 10 ft. from the storm drain. **PAVED LAWNS LEAVE SOLE OF CURB TRASH CANS**
Metal Items - Washers, dryers, hot water heaters, dishwashers, bicycles, lawn mowers, and assorted metal items such as pipe an aluminum chairs (webbing removed). Place curb side.

Paint - Latex paint can be opened and allowed to dry out to be put in the trash. All empty paint cans are trash and cannot be recycled. **REMEMBER, THE BEST WAY TO GET RID OF PAINT IS TO USE IT UP**

Propane Tanks - Propane Tanks are not picked up by the Township or Waste Management. Call County MUA 465-9026
