RESOLUTION 89-19 – AWARD CONTRACT AND RATIFY AGREEMENT THROUGH NON-FAIR AND OPEN PROCESS– On motion by Committeeman Clark seconded by Committeeman Gandy and passed on roll call, the following resolution was adopted. WHEREAS, the Township of Middle approved Resolution 442-14, August 4, 2014 authorizing the award of a Non-Fair and Open Contract with Jeffrey R. Surenian and Associates, LLC for special counsel towards Affordable Housing Issues; and WHEREAS, said resolution authorized an agreement in the amount of \$12,000.00, and WHEREAS, there is an outstanding balance due for 2014 in the amount of \$3,437.37 for additional work related to Mount Laurel matters, and WHEREAS, the Township of Middle does desire to contract with Jeffrey R. RESOLUTION 92-19 - AUTHORIZING ACTION FOR VIOLATION OF CONDITION OF A SITE PLAN APPROVAL – On motion by Committeeman Clark seconded by Committeeman Gandy and passed on roll call, the following resolution was adopted. WHEREAS, Resolution # 041203F was passed by the Middle Township Planning Board on June 24, 2004 and memorialized on July 13, 2004, granting Final Approval of a Major Subdivision to Thomas Sandler, III as to Block 166, Lot 26 and to Edmund T. Dougherty as to Block 166, Lot 7, a copy of which is annexed hereto; and WHEREAS said subdivision was filed in the office of the Clerk of Cape May County on May 12 2006 under filing number 9821 A & B; and WHEREAS, a continuing condition of said subdivision approval required that a Bank Letter of Credit or Bond remain in force until all improvements on site were completed; and WHEREAS, an Irrevocable Standby Letter of Credit was issued by Harvest Bank, in that regard, in the amount of \$609,000 on April 28, 2006 bearing LOC# 99-00000131; and WHEREAS, Harvest Bank has since become insolvent and all of its assets, liabilities and letters of credit have been assumed by First Citizens Bank and Trust Company, 100 East Tryon Road, Raleigh, North Carolina 27603; and

WHEREAS, First Citizens Bank and Trust Company claims to have no record of said Irrevocable Standby Letter of Credit previously issued by Harvest Bank as referenced above; and WHEREAS site improvements have not been completed on the subject property; and WHEREAS a Consent Order and Settlement Agreement were also filed with regard to a lawsuit commenced in the United States District Court, regarding the subject property under the caption "Cape May Affordable Housing, LP versus Township of Middle, et al", under case number 1:16 Dash cv- 08522 RMB- AMD; and

WHEREAS, a material provision of said Consent Order, and the Settlement Agreement filed in conjunction therewith, was the continued viability of the Irrevocable Standby Letter of Credit issued by Harvest Bank pursuant to the Planning Board Resolution referenced above; and WHEREAS, as aforesaid, said Irrevocable Standby Letter of Credit was posted to insure the completion of site improvements and appears to no longer be viable, as aforesaid; and WHEREAS, ownership of the property is now held by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) which seeks to sell or develop same and which has not posted a replacement bond or Letter of Credit to secure site improvements;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE, the governing body of the Township of Middle, as follows:

1. The averments set forth above are incorporated herein as if set forth at length;
2. No certificates of occupancy or building permits shall be issued with regard to any of the subdivided lots on site until such time as a viable letter of credit or bond is posted in accordance with the requirements of the subdivision resolution referenced herein;
3. All work proceeding on site shall cease and desist until such time as a viable letter of credit or bond posted in accordance with the requirements of the subdivision resolution has been properly installed;
4. The Municipal Clerk/Administrator, Construction Official, Zoning Officer and all other appropriate personnel, agent, servants and employees of the Township of Middle are hereby empowered and authorized to take such action as may be necessary to implement to the provisions of this resolution;
5. A copy of this resolution shall be recorded forthwith in the office of the Clerk of the County of Cape May so as to appear in the chain of title of the subject premises.
