6. ORDINANCE 1581-19 - AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE COMPENSATION OF THE OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MIDDLE – Following second reading, hearing, and consideration for adoption, Ordinance 1581-19 was adopted on motion by Committeeman Gandy seconded by Mayor Donohue and passed on roll call. Complete Ordinance is on file in the Clerk’s Office.

*Kimberly Krauss:*

- Explained need to amend several ranges for union contracts.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee, the Governing Body of the Township of Middle, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1. The positions listed in the attached schedule are hereby created.

SECTION 2. The salary ranges specified in the attached schedule are hereby adopted for each and every position listed therein. In those cases where only one rate or figure appears in said schedule, said rate or figure shall be the maximum rate of figure applicable to said position.

In those cases where a maximum and minimum salary are hereby established for a position, the exact salary to be paid to the holder of said position shall be as determined from time to time by resolution of the Township Committee.

SECTION 3. The duties to be performed by each person holding any position listed in said schedule shall be those duties as outlined in Job Description of New Jersey Civil Service Department.

SECTION 4. In addition to the salaries set forth in said schedule, those employees who have held full time positions for a minimum of five years, as hereinafter defined, shall be entitled to additional compensation as set forth in this section, based upon current salary. The additional compensation to which the employee is entitled on January 1 of any year shall be the additional compensation for the entire year. In determining years of service on January 1 of any year, for the purpose of this Ordinance only, no credit shall be given for less than six full months of service in any year, and credit for a full year shall be given for any year in which the employee served for six full months or more.

Years of Service (Percent of Annual Salary)	Additional Compensation
5 years or more	2%
10 years or more	4%
15 years or more	6%
20 years or more	8%
25 years or more	10%

Section 4 shall only apply to Township Employees hired before December 31, 1994.

SECTION 5. All other ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed, to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance shall become effective, retroactive to January 1, 2019 immediately upon final passage and publication according to law.

7. ORDINANCE 1582-19 - AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MIDDLE, COUNTY OF CAPE MAY AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY TO SELL TOWNSHIP OWNED LAND BY A PRIVATE SALE TO A CONTIGUOUS OWNER - On motion by Committeeman Gandy seconded by Mayor Donohue and passed on roll call, Ordinance No. 1582-19 passed first reading. Second reading, public hearing and consideration for adoption will be held on 03/18/2019 at 6:00 p.m.  
BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Committee of the Township of Middle, County of Cape May and State of New Jersey that it is necessary that Township owned land be sold by a private sale to a contiguous owner.
- SECTION 1.  
WHEREAS, New Jersey Statute 40A:12-13 provides the procedure for the sale of Township owned land, and allows for a private sale of land by ordinance when the sale is to the owner of the real property contiguous to the Township owned parcel provided that the property being sold is less than the minimum size required for development under the municipal zoning ordinance and is

without any capital improvement thereon; except that when there is more than one owner with real property contiguous thereto, said property shall be sold to the highest bidder from among all such owners; and also provided that any such sale shall be for not less than the fair market value of the real property; and

WHEREAS, the Township owns a parcel of land identified as Block 722, Lots 3, which parcel is less than the minimum size required for development under the zoning ordinance and which does not have any capital improvement upon it; and

WHEREAS, there is just one owner of contiguous property, namely Jeffrey and Mary Anne Felicano, 1500 Devane Street, Cape May Court House, who owns the adjacent lot identified as Block 722, Lot 1; and

WHEREAS, the Township Tax Assessor has stated to the Township Committee that the total fair market value of the land is to be sold for \$ 1,000.00 plus costs of Survey, Title Insurance, all closing costs, costs of publication, and legal fees. Accordingly, all Township closing expenses, publication expenses and professional fees shall be paid for by the Buyer; and

WHEREAS, Jeffrey and Mary Anne Felicano has offered to purchase the property for \$ 1,000.00 plus costs of Survey, Title Insurance, all closing costs, publication expenses, and legal fees, and agreed to execute a contract contingent upon this Ordinance being approved and all survey and subdivision work being performed at their sole expense; and

WHEREAS, the statute also requires that the municipality file with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs, sworn affidavits verifying the publications of advertisements for the ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED,

1. The Township Committee of the Township of Middle shall sell real property identified as Block 722, Lot 1 to Jeffrey and Mary Anne Felicano for the sale price of \$ 1,000.00 plus costs of Survey, Title Insurance, all closing costs, publication expenses and legal fees. pursuant to the terms of Contract for Sale; and
2. That the Clerk or the Clerk's representative is to file the necessary affidavits with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, and
3. The Mayor, Clerk, and any and all other Township Officials, are hereby authorized to sign those documents necessary to effectuate this transaction; and
4. Any and all closing costs associated with this transaction, including Township closing costs, Attorney fees, advertising and postage, are to be paid by the Buyer.

SECTION 2. All other ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed, to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency.

SECTION 3. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remaining portions of this ordinance shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final passage and publication, according to law.

8. ORDINANCE 1583-19 - AN ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14) - On motion by Committeeman Gandy seconded by Mayor Donohue and passed on roll call, Ordinance No. 1583-19 passed first reading. Second reading, public hearing and consideration for adoption will be held on 03/18/2019 at 6:00 p.m.

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Middle in the County of Cape May finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2019 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee hereby determines that a 1.0% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$196,572.77 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Committee hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Middle, in the County of Cape May, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2019 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Middle shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$688,002.96, and that the CY 2019 municipal budget for the Township of Middle be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:48-2.3 et seq., the Construction Official of the Township of Middle has hereby been designated and appointed as the public officer to exercise the powers prescribed by this chapter, and

WHEREAS, if, after notice and hearing, said public officer determines that the building under consideration is unfit for human habitation or occupancy or use, he shall state, in writing, his findings of fact in support of such determination and shall issue and cause to be served upon the owner thereof and parties in interest an order requiring the repair, alteration or improvement of said building to be made by the owner within a reasonable time, which time shall be set forth in the order, or, at the option of the owner, to vacate or have said building vacated and closed with the time set forth in the order, and

WHEREAS, if the building is in such a condition as to make it dangerous to the health and safety of persons on or near the premises and the owner fails to repair, alter or improve said building within the time specified in the order, then the owner shall be required to remove or demolish said building within the reasonable time specified in the order of removal.

WHEREAS, said need exist for the demolition of a building located at Block 64 Lot 3, otherwise known as 3 Leslie Avenue, Cape May Court House, and

WHEREAS, the public officer, or other official designated under this chapter, may exercise such powers as may be necessary or convenient to carry out and effectuate the purposes and provisions of this chapter, including but not limited to the following powers, in addition to the others herein granted.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Township Committee, the Governing Body of the Township of Middle, County of Cape May and State of New Jersey does hereby acknowledge that the above referenced procedures, as outlined in Chapter 100 of the Township Code, have been

followed, and further directs the public officer to proceed with the repair, alteration, improvement, removal or demolition of 3 Leslie Avenue, Cape May Court House, NJ.
