- Project Updates

Matthew Hender, EDA:

- Discussed completion of Swainton Road Project as well as Linden Lane
- Spoke of upcoming project for drainage and road paving
- Discussed various roads involved in the 2021 drainage project; further discussed the details of each drainage improvement on all roads
- Commented on the various roads being constructed through the 2021 road reconstruction project

Mayor Donohue:

- Asked if bulkhead work in Stone Harbor Manor had been completed

Kimberly Osmundsen:
