ORDINANCE 1664-22 AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MIDDLE, CHAPTER 215, ARTICLE III ENTITLED STREET EXCAVATIONS Following second reading, hearing, and consideration for adoption, Ordinance 1664-22 was adopted on motion by Committeeman Gandy seconded by Committeeman Norris and passed on roll call. Complete Ordinance is on file in the Clerk's Office.

WHEREAS, the current Ordinance pertaining to street excavation permits references a road opening moratorium for a period of five years after the paving of a roadway.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Middle in the County of Cape May and State of New Jersey that the following Ordinance sections shall be amended as follows: § 215-15. Issuance of permit.

<u>D.</u>

No permit shall be issued for any road which has been constructed or reconstructed for a period of five years after the completion of said construction or reconstruction except in an emergency situation.

E.

No permit shall be issued for any road which has been overlaid with bituminous concrete for a period of three years after the completion of said overlay except in an emergency situation.

<u>F.</u>

In the case of emergency or hardship, the Township Committee may, by resolution, waive the five-year and three-year restrictions mentioned previously. When the case presents, the restoration requirement is to restore the road to the original pre-opening condition, but at a minimum, the restoration is to consist of 2" milling and paving of the full lane and/or full shoulder width for a distance of 50lf in both directions beyond the length of the opening.

All trench backfill is to consist of compacted DGA.

SECTION 2. All other ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed, to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency.

SECTION 3. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phase of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remaining portions of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect, and to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be serverable.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final passage and publication, according to law.


