

Mayor Donohue explained the County approved a resolution to replace the Grassy Sounds Fishing pier. They will be upgrading the pier and access to the pier will be free

26. PUBLIC COMMENT:

Dawn Robinson, Burleigh, discussed fiend selling items on lot along Route 9 she owns. Explained police were called on the individual selling the items and she was unaware that selling the items was not allowable. Further discussed a lot down the street where a food truck is selling food.

Kimberly Osmundsen, gave back ground on discussions with the Zoning Official, Rachel Shepherd.

Dawn Robinson, Burleigh, continued to discuss yard sales and food truck sales on properties.

Mayor Donohue, explained research currently be done on food truck licensing and allowances that other municipalities have adopted. He further explained enforcement action is in progress but the process takes time.

Vince Orlando explained options have been provided to the food truck owner to rectify the situation

Dr. Terry Marks, South Paw, began to discuss concerns with the Township's sign ordinance. Explained violation notice she received regarding her banner flag outside her business. Stated she understood the purpose of the regulation for many businesses however this ban is negatively impacting the businesses. Explained is it causing them to lose business. Further spoke of many businesses still flying banners,

Mayor Donohue, explained purpose behind this ordinance is to protect the astatic and traffic safety surrounding these businesses.

Vince Orlando explained certain permits are issued for special events allowing certain banners for special events. Further explained the purpose behind the ordinance was enacted due to the over abundance of flags and banners.

Dr. Terry Marks, South Paw, suggesting changing the ordinance to allow minimal flags and banners.

Mayor Donohue stated he would be open to a discussion with business owners regarding the regulations. Explained all ordinances and regulations have a purpose behind them.

Committeeman Gandy stated the only allowable flag at the moment and one that only states "Open". Explained there are ongoing discussions within the zoning offices regarding there allowances.

Kimberly Osmundsen asked if her concerns are strictly with the eye-catching flags or does she have any concerns about any other part of the sign ordinance.

Dr. Terry Marks, South Paw, clarified her main concern is the section speaking to flags and banners.

Kimberly Osmundsen said she could pull that specific section and provide it to the governing body their review. They can then send it to the Planning Board for review if they choose.

Mayor Donohue stated they would review the current language to confirm the specific allowances.

Tonya Baster, Ritas Water Ice, explained the banner flag flown outside her business helped customers know that they were open. Since she has removed the banner, her business has been impacted as people do not know they are open.

Brian McDowell, Mister Softee, explained he himself looks for the open flag for certain businesses.

Brian McDowell, Mister Softee, requested a cross walk outside his business at the intersection of Hand Avenue and Route 9.

Stan Doniger, Rio Grande, discussed recent interaction with Middle Township Ambulance Corp. (MTAC). Explained he received a donation request from them and asked why they were not able to bill him.

Mayor Donohue explained MTAC has an agreement with Inspira as a back up and received payments from Inspira.

Kimberly Osmundsen further explained stipends MTAC receive from Inspira.

Stan Doniger, Rio Grande, raised his concerns about MTAC funding.

Mayor Donohue gave background between MTAC and Inspira's Mutual Aid Agreement.

Jim Chew, Rio Grande, suggested putting a moratorium on the banner flag restrictions until the ordinance is reviewed; discussed various funds spent on Township events and services instead of on the homeless. Read prepared speech regarding the homeless and proposed resolution 1671-23.

Mayor Donohue explained the proposed ordinance is a necessary tool needed to assist with the homeless population in Middle. Further explained the various services utilized to help assist the homeless. Discussed photos of the homeless encampments made in the woods that are in terrible condition. Explained the complaints the Township has been receiving from adjacent property owners regarding these areas. Stated what Mr. Chew proposes is currently what is ongoing in larger cities causing public health crises. The Township is doing what's best for the overall population of the town and has in addition made requests to the State to assist and provide funds for services and shelters for homeless individuals in the area.

Jim Chew, Rio Grande, explained his efforts made to teach the homeless to clean up after themselves and be good neighbors.

Kimberly Osmundsen discussed videos of him being the one cleaning up around the other individuals and many of the photos are from the areas where he assists the homeless.

Mayor Donohue reiterated the ordinance is a needed tool and will be on the next agenda with a public comment portion.

Dr. Terry Marks, South Par, asked where the sign ordinance stands for enforcement with the business owners.

Mayor Donohue explained his position is to look at what is possible under the current ordinance that would benefit the businesses at this time while the ordinance is being reviewed.

Dr. Terry Marks, South Paw, asked how business owners will know of any changes or clarifications.

Mayor Donohue stated efforts would be made to get the notice out to business owners.

COMMITTEE COMMENTS:

Committeeman Norris congratulated all the Drum Fish Tournament winners. Congratulated Jen Pooler on her promotion. Stated summer basketball signups are ongoing.

Mayor Donohue congratulated Chief Pooler. Spoke of reassurance of seeing her in the audience. Discussed the over 1.4 million dollars received in grant funding for the Township. Expressed it was a great job done by all involved in applying for these funds.

Commented on incident of a gentlemen trying to lure a child from the Dorchester WAWA. Explained that Middle Township Detective Tom Flounders efforts taken assisted in identifying the vehicle and tracking down the perpetrator.
